## GENERAL INFORMATION

The registration fee for the conference is \$10 per person. The fee does not cover lodging and food except for the banquet on March 5. Preregistration is encouraged. All participants should come to the Mississippi Center for Continuation Study, Oxford campus, as soon as possible on March 4 to receive name tags, dormitory housing assignments (if applicable), and additional information. ## HOUSING

Motel-type accommodations are available at the Alumni House adjacent to the Center for Continuation Study on the University campus. Commercial motels are available in Oxford. A limited number of dormitory rooms are available for \$5 per person per night, double occupancy, or \$10 per person per night in a single room. No more than two persons may occupy a dormitory room. Participants who are housed in dormitories should bring linens including blankets and pillows. Participants interested in dormitory accommodations should indicate such on the enclosed registration form. Available dormitory space will be allotted on a first-come-first-served basis. Participants wishing to stay in the Alumni House or a commercial facility should make reservations directly with that facility.
