- Non-Profit organization created by Dolly Parton in 1995, inspired by her father. The Dollywood Foundation mission is to share the life and legacy of Dolly Parton as an inspiration to all children to Dream More, Learn More, Care More and Be More.
- Dolly envisioned creating a lifelong love of reading, inspiring children to dream!







∃ How Dolly Parton's Imagination Library (DPIL) works





Each month, in partnership with Local Champion, Dolly Parton's Imagination Library mails a high quality, ageappropriate book to all registered children, addressed to them, at no cost to the child's family.


The Dollywood Foundation incurs the cost of the program's administrative/overhead expenses and coordinates the monthly book mailing. Provide:

- Infrastructure of the core program
- Secure centralized book ordering system
- Book selection coordination
- Book purchasing and mass printing
- Local program support

Local Champion promotes program, enrolls children, secures funding and pays ~\$2.10/per child per month. Local funds stay local. Affiliate-raised funds go 100% to serving children in their community.

Registered children received specially-selected book personalized with child's name on label, mailed directly to their home every month until their 5th birthday.

≡ Why it is important - Science



If we wait till kindergarten, it is too late

Brain Development

- Baby's brain rapidly grows before entering school: 90% developed by age 4
- Children with access to more books and who are read to more often have greater brain activity in areas involving imagination, language and understanding



Early Experiences
Build Brains

The Reading Network in children's brains doesn't naturally exist; it must be built.

Reading is the key for lifelong learning and the single most important activity for building knowledge required for eventual success in school, work, and life in general.

Parents are first and most influential TEACHER for a child

CHILDREN WILL CONTINUE TO DO WHAT THEY LOVE TO DO – HELP THEM LOVE READING

Reading Network

- Supports cognitive development
- Improves language skills
- Develops empathy
- Increases concentration and discipline
- Develops imagination and creativity

Reading at home requires books

≡ Why It Matters - LOVE









- Books delivered to the home creates an "event"
- Snuggling, sharing and interaction
- Reading together helps to create a bond, a unique, shared experience
- Provides connection between child and caregiver(s), other family members, siblings
- Frequency happens every month
- Sense of ownership and pride books belong to child


Strengthens the home environment. Supports natural tendencies of family children to be healthy

≡ Why It Matters – Impact

Home Literacy Environment

- Families connect around book
- Increase reading 3 times a week from 59.7% to 85.2%



- Build home library (60)
- All family members engaged in reading
- Increased 1:1 time, laying foundation for adult's consistent involvement in their children's learning and development.

Kindergarten Readiness

28.9% increase in readiness for Kindergarten


3rd Grade Reading


Significantly stronger reading skills and scored higher on reading achievement tests consistently from Kindergarten through 3rd Grade (4 years after participating).

Community

- A healing effect manifesting in emerging neighborhood initiatives, increased library usage and literacy
- Creates a shared bond among children, especially important when starting kindergarten
- Ties to Adult Literacy

• The establishment of reading routines brings about increased stability, emotional well-being and improved atmosphere in families.




